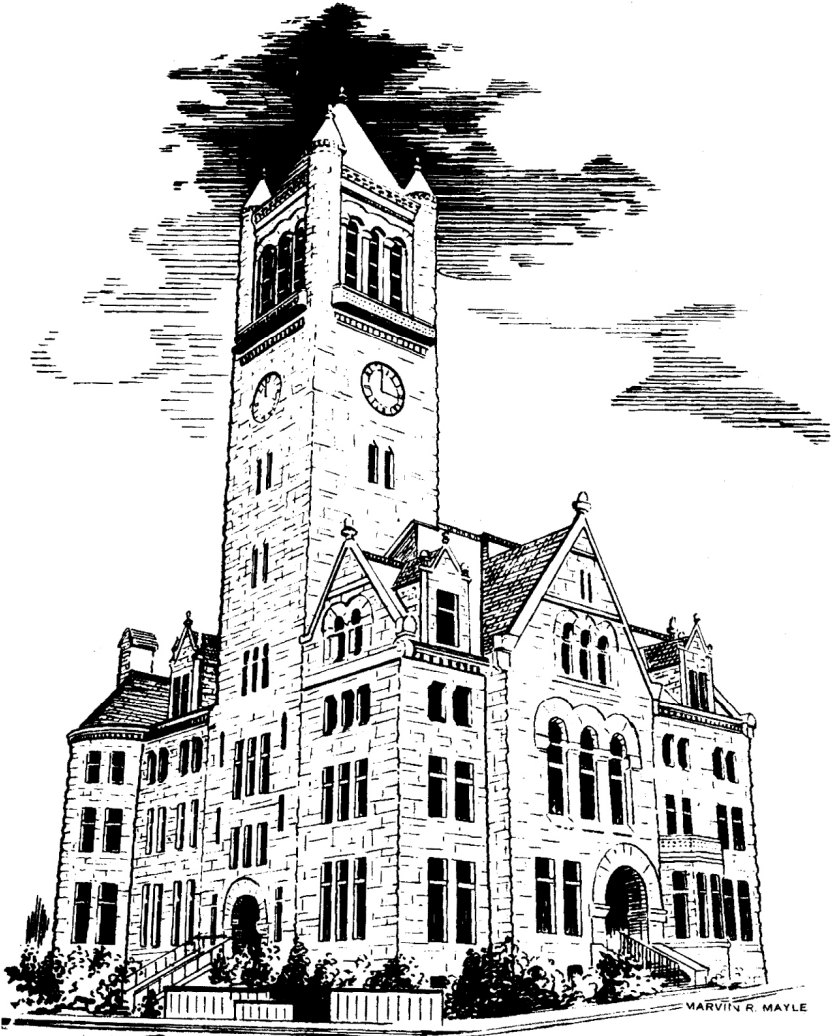

OPINION AND ORDER

GEORGE, J.

April 26, 2023

This matter comes before the Court on Defendant's Omnibus Pretrial Motion in form of a motion to suppress evidence and a motion to suppress the search warrant. On April 18, 2023, a hearing was held on Defendant's Omnibus Pretrial Motion. The parties stipulated to the admission of the transcript from the preliminary hearing and brief testimony of Trooper Kezmarsky. After the hearing and reviewing the Preliminary Hearing Transcript, this motion is DENIED, in its entirety.

ISSUES PRESENTED

Defendant's motion presents the following issues: whether there was probable cause to initiate the traffic stop and effectuate a custodial detention of the Defendant and whether the four corners of the search warrant contain sufficient probable cause.

FACTS

Pennsylvania State Police VICE with the help of an informant orchestrated a controlled buy of two kilograms of cocaine to be delivered to the Fayette County area by a man named David Stewart. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 6). The informant had arranged the date, time, and place of the purchase for Troopers to execute a "buy bust". On the date set, Troopers positively identified Defendant at the Sheetz located in Uniontown. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 6). Another man was driving and Defendant was seated in the passenger side. Troopers followed the vehicle from the Sheetz to the Quality Inn on McClellandtown Road in South Union Township. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 6-7). When the vehicle attempted to leave the Quality Inn parking lot Troopers stopped the vehicle. Troopers then used a drug dog to sweep the vehicle and the dog alerted to the presence of narcotics. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 7). After obtaining a sealed warrant they searched the vehicle. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 7). The search resulted in approximately two kilograms of cocaine, a large scale, loaded Glock 9mm model 26 with an extra loaded magazine, and several other items. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 8).

DISCUSSION

Count I: Motion to Suppress

The Defendant argues that the Police did not have probable cause to initiate the traffic stop or effectuate a custodial detention of the Defendant and as such all evidence found as a result of the illegal search and seizure must be suppressed. The Defendant argues that the stop was only effectuated because of a Confidential Informant tip and that was not enough for probable cause.

However, an informant's tip may constitute probable cause where police independently corroborate the tip, or where the informant has provided accurate information of criminal activity in the past, or where the informant himself participated in the criminal activity. Commonwealth v. Manuel, 194 A.3d 1076, (Pa. Super. 2018), citing Commonwealth v. Clark, 611 Pa. 601, 28 A.3d 1284, (2011).

Here, the informant was a participant in the purchase and at the direction of the police, arranged the details. At the Preliminary Hearing, Defense Attorney, Shane Gannon asked Trooper Kezmarsky "You indicated that this was a controlled purchase, a set up so to speak." (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 13). Trooper responded, "It would have been referred to as a buy bust." (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 14). Attorney Gannon further questioned Trooper Kezmarsky regarding the information Troopers had about the buy. Trooper Kezmarsky testified that the informant gave information regarding the type and amount of drugs, the seller of the drugs and that it was to take place in the parking lot of the Quality Inn on McClellandtown Road in South Union Township. Clearly, the informant was involved in the criminal activity and as such the involvement of the informant in the criminal activity of setting up the purchase of illegal drugs is sufficient to establish probable cause.

Count II: Motion to Suppress Search Warrant

The Defendant argues that the four corners of the search warrant lack probable cause and all evidence obtained from the vehicle should be suppressed.

The standard for evaluating whether probable cause exists for the issuance of a search warrant is the same under both the Fourth Amendment and Article I, § 8: the "totality of the circumstances" test set forth in *Illinois v. Gates*, 462 U.S. 213, 103 S.Ct. (1983). This Court specifically adopted that standard as a matter of Pennsylvania constitutional law in *Commonwealth v. Gray*, 509 Pa. 476, 503 A.2d 921 (1985). Pursuant to the "totality of the circumstances," the task of an issuing authority is "simply to make a practical, common-sense decision whether, given all of the circumstances set forth in the affidavit before him, including the 'veracity' and 'basis of knowledge' of persons supplying hearsay information, there is a fair probability that contraband or evidence of a crime will be found in a particular place." *Gray*, 509 Pa. at 484, 503 A.2d at 925 (quoting *Gates*, 462 U.S. at 238-39, 103 S.Ct. at 2332). Thus, the totality of the circumstances test "permits a balanced assessment of the relative weights of all the various indicia of reliability (and unreliability) attending an informant's tip." *Gates*, 462 U.S. at 234, 103 S.Ct. 2317, *Commonwealth v. Smith*, 2001 PA Super 284, 784 A.2d 182, 187 (2001).

Here, we have an informant that told the police he/she was able to purchase two kilograms of cocaine from a man he/she knew as David and supplied a phone number at which he/she was communicating regarding this transaction. When the phone number was queried it returned to Defendant, David Stewart. Then the informant identified the Defendant from a photo provided by the police after verifying his phone number. The informant continued to be in contact with Defendant regarding the transaction. They established a date, time, and place which the transaction was to take place. Additionally, the informant knew where the Defendant was traveling from. Thus, the totality of the circumstances weighed toward finding the informant's information was reliable enough to issue a search warrant. Therefore, the underlying basis of the informant's knowledge showed that there was a fair probability that contraband or evidence of a crime would be found in the vehicle with Defendant and the search warrant contains sufficient probable cause.

WHEREFORE, we will enter the following order:

ORDER

AND NOW, this 26th day of April, 2023, it is hereby ORDERED and DECREED that the Omnibus Pre-Trial Motion is DENIED, in its entirety, for the reasons set forth in our Opinion. The District Attorney is DIRECTED to list this matter for trial.
